

The train which arrived at 1.30 p.m. did not however bring them along Several the have been received in connection the movements of S.S. Sebasto which has orders to proceed to Ar centia and take the police officers to Harbor Buffett. In a message to the Minister of Justice it was sta that the Sebastopol had arrived at Argentia vesterday at 3 p.m. and was leaving for Harbor Buffett at 11 o' clock. The Shipping department received a message stating that the Sebastopol had left Argentia at 6 o'clock this morning presumably on her regular route. Acting on orders from the Justice Department the police will bring on the crew of the Centaurus and the body of the dead sailor immediately the arrests are made. Interviewed by the Telegram this morning the Deputy Minister would not state who did the shooting, although he admitted having a message which would be tantamount to the captain's defence, so that it is surmised that he shot the seamen. The two men wounded are only slightly so. A message to Mr. W. A. McKay of the Telegram staff dated yesterday stated that only the Danish crew were on board the vessel when the mutiny occurred and that no person from the shore had gone on board the vessel up to that time.
