THE WHELAN TRIAL.

Special Despatch to the "Mercury" from our own Correspondent.

OTTAWA, Sept. 7.

The trial of Jas. Whelan for the murder of the Hon. Thos. D'Arcy McGee was commenced at 9 a. m. The Court room was densely crowded and much excitement prevailed in the city.

Abolition of Religious Tests in the English Universities.

One of the most important questions, subordinate to that of Irish grievances, with which the new British Parliament will have to deal, will be the proposed abolition of religious tests in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge.
