On the eve of his election, speaking of his opponent, he said S'r George Car-tier had lost his popularity, accord-ing to his best friends and canvas-He did not reckon on his sers. popularity to get elected this time, popularity to get elected this time, but on two methods—one was by help of money, and the other by pres-sure, causing tenants to be evicted when they would not vote for him. He believed from what he learned from the canvassers, that he (Mr. Jette) would have a majority of 1,200 on the day of the election.




