Each wing consists of two oblong shells of rubberized silk, one directly above the other. At the sharp "beak" of this gigantic bird and at right angles to it is another rudder very closely resembling a large Chinese kite. Its purpose is to steer the airship upward or downward. The aviator does this by tilting it by means of one part of this complicated steering gear.

Mounted on Tires.

The whole ship is mounted on three small pneumatic tired wheels, two at the stern and one at the prow. They is made. As previously stated, the airship provides its own "flying start."
