HUERTA AGREES TO FIRST STEPS IN NEGOTIATIONS

Is Urged to This Decision by
European Powers, Including
Britain.

AMERICANS ALLOWED TO LEAVE MEXICO CITY

Various Theories As To What
Plans of Republics of South
America May Be.

CONFERENCES ARE HELD

Mexican Refugees Held by
U. S. to be Transferred to
New Mexico.

Conferences of the Latin-American
diplomats representing Brazil, Chile
and Argentina, who offered their good
offices to compose the Mexican situa-
tion, followed quickly today further ad-
vancing messages from Mexico City that
General Huerta had agreed to the first
steps in the intermediation negotia-
tions.

The Spanish ambassador, Mr. Riano,
was in early conference with the Ar-
gentine Minister, Mr. Naon, concerning
the next move to be made by the Ar-
gentine Republic. The Chilean Minis-
ter, Mr. Gama, also was present. The
Chilean Minister, Mr. Gama, following
the conference, called upon the Ar-
gentine Minister, Mr. Naon, and a state-
ment was expected later in the day
relating to the next move to be made in the situation.

POWERS URGE HUERTA.

Secretary Bryan informed President
Wilson of the advances that Huerta had
accorded to the preliminary steps in the
mediation proposals. Further encour-
agement in the situation came in ad-
vances from Berlin that Germany
vices from France and Great Britain had urged
Huerta, through their diplomatic re-
presentatives in Mexico City, to yield
to the American demands. When this
was communicated to the president he
was greatly pleased.

Later, the German ambassador, Mr. Von
Bernsdorff, informed Secretary
Bryan that his Government would sup-
port the mediation proposal.

TRANSPORTATIONS PROVIDED.

An official dispatch from Admiral
Bridges to the navy department de-
clared that the authorities in Mexico
City had agreed to provide transpor-
tation for all Americans from Mexico
City as far as Vera Cruz, the Mexican
controlled end of the railroad to Vera
Cruz. It was announced that the first
train with 250 American refugees would
leave Mexico City today. The con-
clusion of negotiations in this con-
nection was gratifying to the President
and Secretary Bryan as well as the
war department officials.

REBELS ATTACK PLANT AS FORMER LONDONER IS WRITING LETTER HOME

Charles Riach, in Centre of Mexican Trouble, Has Letter
Writing Interrupted by Shots as Rebels Attempt to
Cut Pipe Lines of Power Plant Under His Charge.

In the midst of alarms, open rebellion,
bloodshed and destruction of the property
which his duty impelled him to protect by
any means, Charles Riach, formerly of
the Huron and Erie, of this city, now
general manager of Pearson's, Limited,
at Pueblo, Mexico, has been for three
years in the thickest of the dangers which
have confronted Americans or Canadians
in the unhappy land.

Mr. Riach has been for ten years in
Mexico. Before leaving this city he was
for six years with the Huron and Erie,
and he went to the southern republic to
take up financial accounting. After be-
ing with a number of important firms he
became the general manager for Pear-
son's, Limited, the great English syndi-
cate which controls most of the public
utilities of Mexico at Pueblo, a city of
more than 100,000 inhabitants between
Tampico and Mexico City. Under Mr.
Riach's supervision are the light, heat,
power, traction and water services of this
city, and upon him has come the re-
sponsibility for the safety of the many
plants of the company in and out of the
city. The electric service includes sev-
eral waterpower developments similar to
the hydro-electric of Ontario, and as the
plants are located at a distance from
Pueblo they have been repeatedly sub-
jected to attack by rebels and marauders.

WRITES AS ATTACK IS MADE.

BOOST FOR CANADIAN LEAGUE; GIVEN CLASS "B" STANDING

Salary Limit Advanced and Draft Price Increased—Inter-
national Magnates Gave Aid in Securing Higher
Position for "Fastest Minor League."

IMPROVES THE WHOLE SITUATION

Toronto, April 27.—President J. P. Fitzgerald, of the Canadian League,
has succeeded, after a prolonged fight, in getting Class "B" standing for
the Canadian League.

The announcement came this morning from Secretary Farrell, of the
National Association. This decision is of most vital importance to the
Canadian League.

A GREAT AID TO THE LEAGUE.

Aside from the fact that it gives the league a much better standing in
the baseball world it means the raising of the salary limit for players, and
also that major league clubs drafting players from the Canadian League
must now pay \$750, \$250 more than the price of a man drafted from a
Class "C" league.

POPULATION THE TICKLER.

The Class "B" rating was refused by Secretary Farrell on the ground
that the last Federal census did not warrant granting the Canadian League
this status.

Technically he was right. The census is the official record of population,
but since the last census there has been more than sufficient increase in
population to justify the change.

President Fitzgerald appealed to the National Commission, and made
out such a strong case that the commission referred the matter back again
to Mr. Farrell, with a recommendation that the Class "B" rating be granted
for the year 1914.

AID FROM EASTERN MAGNATES.

The announcement of the favorable decision was received this morning.
President Barrow, of the International League, and President McCaffrey, of
the Toronto Baseball Club, lent strong assistance in securing the decision.

WANT TO SEE THE FUN

Suggestion of Opportunities for
Surgical Work Takes With
Medicos.

Should the war between the United
States and Mexico assume a serious as-

medical class at the Western University
will volunteer their services to the United

them have remained in the thick of the
trouble for three years.

ARREST AT WOODSTOCK OF LONDON MAN BELIEVED TO HAVE CLEARED UP CASE.

London police officials believe that with
the arrest and indefinite sentence in
Woodstock of George Pearce, a London
dope fiend, the mystery of where a num-
ber of local unfortunate secured their supply
of drugs has at last been solved.

For a long time the local police have
received complaints that some person was
supplying "dope" to London pipe and
needle users, but until the arrest of
Pearce, they have been at a loss to dis-
cover just who was the go-between.

Chief of Police W. T. Williams, in
communication with the Woodstock au-
thorities, learned that from letters found
on Pearce he was making a practice of
supplying dope fiends with their luxuries.
A morphine outfit with a large quantity
of drugs, found on the prisoner, was con-
fiscated.

Pearce has appeared in court here a
number of times, and while admitting he
was a dope fiend, the police never found
any of the stuff on him.
