**"Safety First" Special Back**—The "Safety First" special train with Superintendent W. R. Davidson and 20 other local Grand Trunk officials on board, returned to London yesterday afternoon after spending a little more than a week inspecting the lines in the London division. Throughout the division the "safety first" regulations are being closely observed, and every effort is being made to lessen the number of accidents on the road.

**Peter Taft Near Recovery**—Peter Taft, 4% Eastview street, was prostrated by a sunstroke several days ago, has almost entirely recovered. His condition at first was so serious that his recovery was not expected. His case has been the only one so far in London, where the heat of several weeks ago had a serious effect. ## BACK FROM O. A. C. WITH MANY IDEAS

Some 250 Middlesex Farmers Who Spent Day at Guelph Receive Good Tips.

**DR. CREELMAN WELCOMES**

Big Turnout of Farmers' Sons Feature of Excursion to Model Farm.

The East Middlesex Farmers' Institute held a most successful Guelph O. A. C. excursion yesterday, when more than 250 of its members "knocked off" work to take in the annual trip to the Royal City Institute.

A feature of the excursion was the number of farmers' sons present. It would seem that the farmers of the district are beginning to realize that much useful agricultural information is to be gained by a visit to the college this time of the year.

"We couldn't have had a better day," said W. B. Harding, of Thorndale, president of the institute, to The Advertiser reporter who accompanied the excursion. "I take these trips every year, and never fail to bring home ideas and information that have meant money to me. They always treat us splendidly at the college, and it is a treat to see the way the grounds are kept."

The excursionists arrived at the college just in time for dinner, and after Dr. G. C. Creelman's address of welcome they did ample justice to the lunch served in the college gymnasium.

Directly after lunch 90 per cent of the farmers followed Prof. W. J. Squire, of the field husbandry department, to the 75 acres of experimental plots. Each plot is 1-100th of an acre in size, the soil being the average Ontario clay loam, having about the same rotation as the average farm. The visitors were taken up the centre road, and the principal objects of the experiments were 100 varieties of winter wheat, the three best being American Baume, American Wonder and Dawson's Golden City.

Professor Squire explained that the spring wheat crop has decreased very largely in Ontario during the last fifteen years, at one time a half million acres being grown, while at present there were not more than one hundred thousand under cultivation. "This change is due to the change in crop rotation, the fact that spring wheat can be raised more economically in western Canada, and that winter wheat outyielded spring wheat in Ontario."

The farmers were shown over 200 varieties of alfalfa being grown, the hardest and most productive being Grimms, Ontario variegated, and sand. Next, the three plant breeding ranges were visited. The plant breeding at Guelph is the most extensive carried on in America. The field husbandry department has records of 100,000 plants that are hybrids and selections. The principal new varieties produced from plant breeding are: O. A. C. No. 21, barley; O. A. C. No. 72, oats; O. A. C. No. 3, oats (early) and O. A. C. No. 61, rye. All these varieties are outgrowing the standard varieties grown in the province.

The majority of the live stock was out on pasture and was not inspected. The new dairy barn proved to be very interesting, being fitted up with all the latest devices and model in every respect.

making in the dairy department, while the new \$40,000 poultry building came in for its share of attention.

Many were interested in Prof. Crow's plant breeding experiments in the Horticulture department. Prof. Crow has between six and seven thousand different cross-red strawberry plants, from which he eventually hopes to get a few winners. At present Parsons Beauty is by far the best variety grown.

The afternoon went all too quickly, many expressing the opinion that they could stay at the college for a week and not see everything.

The excursion train arrived in London at 10:30 p. m., the farmers returning to their homes with the satisfaction that for once they had combined business and pleasure.

**WANT HYDRO TO NAME MEN FOR ARBITRATION**

Electrical Workers Feel They Are Being Ignored in Plea for Better Conditions.

Although the appointment of John D. Jacobs, named by the electrical workers as a member of the board of arbitration in the dispute between the hydro-electric department here and its employees, was ratified by the Minister of Labor on June 8, the hydro people have apparently ignored the matter and have not yet named their representative.

The men have been asking for increases and better conditions since early last spring, and had hoped to secure a settlement by the first of last May. No response has yet been received from the hydro-electric department in the matter, although the appeal for a board of arbitration, provided for under the Lemieux act was granted by the department of labor about a month ago.

On the appointment of the hydro department's representative, he with Mr. Jacobs will appoint a third member. The Public Utilities Commission is awaiting the result of arbitration in Toronto when it is expected a uniform scale to apply to all hydro cities in the province will be adopted.
