# British Officer Jumps Into Sea To Save German

LONDON, May 3 .- 9:50 p.m .- The admiralty in a statement issued this evening says after the naval action in the North Sea Saturday after-noon when the British destroyer Recruit and two German toppedo boats were sunk, strenuous efforts were made to rescue the German sailors, Lieut, Henry J. Hartnell going into the water himself to save a German.

German prisoners, the admiralty statement adds, stated that they had sunk a British trawler before being sighted by the British destroyer Laforev and that they had picked up a two-striped officer that is a lieutenant, and two men. When asked what had become of their captives, the Germans stated that the prisoners were below and as the time was short, it must therefore be concluded that the officer and the two men perished.
