"Possibly with Canadian steamers," said Mr. Marconl. "Our Cape Race station is 80 miles from the eastbound course, or 140 miles from the eastbound course of the northern route. This route is only used for five months in the year, from August to January, by trans-Atlantic steamers, which for the remaining seven months take a southern route over 200 miles further away.

"There is no immediate probability," he concluded, "of any station being established by which ocean steamers can communicate with America before they come within the radius of the station at Nantucket, Sable Island, which has been spoken of so much, is out of the question, and Cape Race is out of reach."
