The War in the Soudan.

The news from Egypt is discouraging, A great disaster has overtaken the British cause just when victory seemed complete. Khartoum, the capital of the Soudan where Gordon had held out for ten months, against the Arab hordes, has fallen into the hands of the enemy, Just how the disaster occurred, is yet not definitely known, though it is believed to have been the result of treachery on the part of Gordon's Arab forces, who opened the gates of the city, and let the rebels in. The fate of Gordon himself is wrapped in mystery, and to find out whather he is dead er alive, is the object of England.

That Khartoum should be surrendered when Wolseley and his victorious hosts were within a short distance of its battlements, seems hard indeed, and many months, great treasures and loss of brave lives will be required to retrieve the misfortunes to the British arms, and re-establish British prestige in Egypt. The excitement in England is intense. There is a sweeping demand that Khartoum be retaken at any cost, and Gordon's fate discovered.
