CANADIAN CATTLE

EXPORT WITHOUT LESS

Great Britain Offers Unrestricted

Market.

QUALITY IS OF HIGHEST

Commissioner of Agriculture

Concludes Survey.

OTTAWA, July 3.—(Canadian Press)

Great Britain offers an unrestricted

market for Canadian cattle of the feeder

type, in the opinion of Duncan Mar-

shall, commissioner of agriculture, who

has just returned from some four

months' study of the overseas situa-

tion.

Mr. Marshall is convinced that the

British market can absorb as much live

cattle as Canada can ship, in addition

to the feeders, which arrived from Ire-

land. In spite of the shorter journey

from Ireland, he said, the unanimous

opinion of the traders was that Irish

cattle compared unfavorably with Can-

adian cattle on their arrival. Shipments

from Canada so far have come of the

best quality and in excellent condition,

showing a shrinkage of only one-half of

one per cent, from Montreal weights. With

regard to the cattle killed at Montreal

and shipped as chilled, Mr. Marshall

said this compared more favorably

with chilled beef from the Argentine

Republic. The latter has the disadvan-

tage of a longer journey and it contains

a certain amount of ice, from which

the Canadian beef is free. The diffi-

culty, however, is that chilled beef from

Canada is apt to arrive in Britain at a

moment when the market is glutted

with large shipments from Argentina,

which plays havoc with the prices.

AT OPPORTUNE TIME.

The re-education of Canadian cattle

into Britain came at a very opportune

time, Mr. Marshall contended, inas-

much as there was an abundance of feed

especially in Scotland. British traders

who remember the Canadian steers of

30 years ago, declared that Canada had

made remarkable progress in breeding.

The farmers who bought from the first

shipments this year are anxious for

more and there will be a good demand

for Canadian feeders in the fall if

crops in Great Britain are satisfactory.

The complete cost of shipping Cana-

dian cattle from Liverpool, with two

days' feed in Montreal, and selling them

on the Liverpool market, paying all

freight, amounted to \$3.92 per hundred

pounds. The 25 head killed at Liverpool

dressed 27.4 per cent. They looked very

well hung up, except that the flanks

showed a little dark as the result of the

journey. The price obtained was equal,

after deducting all charges, to a live

weight price of \$8.24 at Montreal.

FOUR MORE VICTIMS

OF "CANNED HEAT"

One Man Blind and Three Others in a

Hospital From Drink.
