It is situated in a beautifully-wooded natural park of some 90 acres, sheltered from north and north-west winds by rocky ridges and pine forest. It has a southern and south-western aspect, overlooking Muskoka Bay, the southern arm of Lake Muskoka. It is a mile and a half from Muskoka Wharf, and is the first point of call for steamers on their daily trips up the lake.

The aim of the Muskoka Cottage Sanatorium is to offer those in the early stages of lung disease the advantages of a change of climate, a well-regulated out-of-door life with hygienic surroundings, a nourishing diet, and the latest and most approved methods of medical treatment. Experience has shown that nowhere can the necessary daily regulation of the patient's life and habits be so successfully carried out as in a sanatorium.

The Muskoka Cottage Sanatorium is built on the cottage plan, with a central administration building, around which are grouped the various cottages.

The rates are \$12.00 a week, with a few special rooms at \$15.00.

THE FREE INSTITUTION:

MUSKOKA FREE HOSPITAL FOR CONSUMPTIVES

ESTABLISHED APRIL, 1902

This institution is for those unable to pay anything or who can only pay in part for their maintenance. Like the sister institution, the Cottage Sanatorium, it is intended for those in the earlier stages of the disease, and is situated about one mile distant from the Cottage Sanatorium.

Seven hundred and thirteen patients have been cared for in the Free Hospital since first opened in April, 1902.

More than one-half of the patients in residence are there as absolutely free patients or as charity patients from their several municipalities. Some pay in part themselves on a basis of \$3.00, \$4.00, and in a few cases \$5.00 or \$6.00 a week. When this can be done then it is expected that patients will enter on this basis.

Not a single applicant has ever been refused admission to the Hospital because of his or her poverty. Applications for admission to the Free Hospital should be made direct to the head office, Toronto, and will always receive prompt attention.
