### On clause 1-Capital murder defined.

**Mr. Brewin:** Mr. Chairman, when this bill was debated on second reading I made the statement that I proposed to move an amendment at the committee stage which would have the effect of producing a bill that would provide for the total abolition of capital punishment. At that time I gave the reasons why it appeared to me and several others that the principle which we have just approved on second reading would apply with equal force to the exceptions set out in this bill. I have no intention of repeating at length the arguments made at that time.

The justification for capital punishment, I feel, is based almost entirely on the question of deterrence. There are some people who
