I may perhaps move this amendment at another stage of the bill, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker: The hon. member is seeking unanimous agreement to withdraw the amendment. Is this agreed?

Mr. Speaker: The House will now proceed to the taking of the deferred division in respect of the motion of the hon. member for Comox-Alberni (Mr. Barnett) to amend Bill C-202.

Some hon. Members: Nay.

Mr. Speaker: In my opinion the nays have it.

Mr. Knowles (Winnipeg North Centre): Mr. Speaker, I rise on a point of order. Was not this vote ordered yesterday? Is it necessary to defer this?

Mr. Speaker: The question is the following one. The hon. member for Comox-Alberni (Mr. Barnett) moves:

That Bill C-202, an Act to prevent pollution of areas of the Arctic waters, adjacent to the mainland and islands of the Canadian Arctic, be amended by adding thereto, on page 13 immediately after Clause 13, the following:

"14. The Governor in Council shall cause to be undertaken by such agencies as he deems appropriate continuing programs of research directed to furthering the objectives of this Act." and by renumbering the subsequent clauses accordingly.
