Dear Colonel Bovey,

This letter is to introduce the bearer, Mr Alexander Law, who comes to you as successor to Mr Douglas Gower. My letter to you of 17th July explains, I think, fully my action in relation to Mr Law's emoluments and also the purposes for which Mr Law is coming to Canada. I think you will find him an excellent fellow in every respect. I have had him medically inspected and he is pronounced fit in every way.

I have furnished Mr Law with the sum of £50 to meet travelling expenses and take it that you will make payments to him throughout the session as from 1st October along the same lines as those which you adopted for Mr Gower.

I need hardly say that in company with the Director of Studies at the Glasgow Centre I was grieved beyond words to hear just a few days ago of the death of MacOdrum's wife. I understand that he is proceeding to Canada at once and we have, of course, under the circumstances, left the matter entirely open as to his return here. I hope sincerely, however, that he will return and complete his second year of the Scholarship. I cannot write more definitely regarding the payment of his emoluments just now but he may rest assured that if, and when, he returns to this country, we shall at once take steps to ensure that his Scholarship monies are paid regularly.

An unkind fate seems to have dogged the first year of our joint operations. I hope most sincerely that the future will be brighter.
