Dear Mr. Burpee,

Professor Stanley has shown me the correspondence which has passed between you during my absence on the subject of delegates to the meeting of the British Association for the Advancement of Science.

I note that in your letter of February 20th you say, "As Professor Clarke is to be a guest of the Association, I presume it will not be necessary, so far as he is concerned, to set apart any portion of the special grant for travelling expenses". Neither Professor Clarke nor this University have received any information that his travelling expenses would be paid by the British Association. We shall, therefore, be obliged to set aside for him a part of the \$360 allotted to McGill out of the £500. grant made by the British Association to cover expenses of Canadian delegates.

The \$360 allotted to McGill will, therefore, be divided between Professors Eve, Clarke and Lloyd.
