I also fend you back, Sir, as totally inadmissibile, the Memorial relating to the King of *Prussia*, as affecting the Honour of *Great Britain*, and the unshaken Fidelity with which His Majesty will fulfil His Engagements with His Allies.

Extract of a Letter from the Earl of Bristol to Mr. Secretary Pitt, dated Segovia, August 31, 1761. Received September 11.

I MUST now acknowledge the Receipt of a Copy of your Letter of the 24th of *July* to *M. de Buffy*, together with Copies of two Memorials presented by that Minister, both of which Performances you returned back as totally inadmissibile.

A few Hours after the Messenger *Ardouin* arrived at *Segovia*, I went to *St. Ildephonso*, where I passed a considerable Time with Gen. *Wall*; and as I have had four other Conferences with his Excellency since the first, I will set down, with the utmost Precision in my Power, all that has passed between us,
