Day's Work Council... LOCAL SEWERAGE SYSTEM

Says Yonge-Street Offers Big Obstacle to City Connection With North Toronto Plant.

NORTH TORONTO, Nov. 9.—(Special.)—With reference to draining the whole of North Toronto sewage into the city sewer at Yonge-street, it would be necessary to construct a sewer upon Yonge-street, upon a gradient favoring either a bridge to carry the sewer over the ravine, or raising the grade of Yonge-street in the valley opposite Mount Pleasant Cemetery or the use of a siphon.

WEST TORONTO, Nov. 9.—(Special.)—An act of great development along C.P.R. terminal facilities and increased yard accommodation was brought to light this morning by the announcement that the company have bought 55 acres of level land, the old Macdonald Farm, situated between West and Mount Dennis, and that active operations will shortly commence for the laying out of modern yards.
