St. James' Cathedral. Highly gratifying were the reports of the wardens and the several committees presented at the annual vestry meeting at St. James' Cathedral last night.

All Saints. Exceedingly satisfactory reports of progress in all branches of the work in connection with the Church of All Saints, Sherbourne-street, were the chief feature at the annual vestry meeting last night.

Grace Church. A very satisfactory financial statement was presented at the first vestry meeting held at Grace Church, College Heights.

St. Paul's. At St. Paul's, East Bloor-street, the best financial statement in the history of the church was presented by the wardens.

St. George's. Excellent reports were presented at the annual meeting of the Church of St. George's, showing all branches of the work to be in flourishing condition.

St. David's, Inglewood Ave. St. David's, Inglewood-avenue, is the baby parish of the city. It has only been in existence as a parish since April 1, although it was established as a mission five years ago.

Holy Trinity. A marked progress was reported at Holy Trinity. Despite the fact that the residential districts are steadily receding from the vicinity of the church, the parish has added materially to its membership during the past year.

Church of Epiphany. The twenty-fifth annual report of the Church of Epiphany showed total receipts of \$22,651.48, and disbursements of \$11,947.57, leaving a balance of \$10,703.91.

St. Augustine's Church. The annual receipts for the year amounted to \$18,087.47, and the expenditures were as follows: \$500 was paid for the purchase of the rectory and parish house.

St. Mark's, Parkdale. The annual vestry meeting of St. Mark's, Parkdale, was held last night. The report of the rector, Rev. W. H. Armitage, the new rector, presided over the vestry for the first time.

St. Matthew's. The meeting at St. Matthew's parish was presided over by the acting rector, Rev. Dr. T. Stannage Boyle.

St. Matthias'. A financial condition "perfectly sound and entirely satisfactory," to quote the words of the rector, was indicated by the reports presented at the vestry meeting of St. Matthias' Church, Bellwoods-avenue, showing a balance of \$138,674, total receipts for the year being \$23,597, and disbursements \$23,143.

St. Cyril's. Total amount raised for all purposes from all sources at St. Cyril's during the year was \$4943. The church debt was reduced by \$100. The vestry increased the stipend of the rector, Rev. R. Seaborn, by \$200, and the salaries of the organist by \$150, and of the sexton by \$50.

Church of the Ascension. An extra draw on the general funds of this downtown church was well made up by work done by several organizations. The total receipts for the year were \$4170, of which \$325 was devoted to missions.

St. John's. The vestry was unable to complete all the business last night and adjourned for two weeks. The revenue for the year was the largest in the history of the parish, amounting to \$1730, in addition to \$1100 raised for a new parish house building.

St. Anne's. The past year was an eventful one in the history of St. Anne's. In the twelve months the church completed a new rectory at a cost of over eight thousand dollars.

St. Michael's and All Angels'. The annual vestry meeting of St. Michael's and All Angels' was held last night. The report of the rector, Rev. W. J. Brain, showed a very successful year.

St. Clement's. The congregation expects to spend \$20,000 as a start on a new church building on Jones-avenue, which will hold 750 people.

Church of the Redeemer. The annual vestry meeting of this church was held last night. There was a large attendance of new and old worshippers.

St. Edmund's. St. Edmund's Church, corner of Dovercourt and Davenport-roads, held its first vestry meeting last night.

St. John's, the Baptist. The church of St. John the Baptist, Woodbine-avenue, was shown to be in a sound financial condition.
