SYNDICATE FARM  
IN KENT COUNTY

Toledo Men Will Make Desolate Marsh to Blossom as the Rose.

CHATHAM, Oct. 25.—(Special).—A new agricultural development has started in Kent County. The land near the lighthouse on Lake St. Clair which has been considered nothing but a worthless marsh, has been purchased by a Toledo syndicate who will conduct farming operations on a modern and enlarged scale. Mr. Bradley, an agricultural expert, has been placed in charge of it, and the company are now erecting houses for their workmen.

Two large pumping schemes have been installed and the land is being reclaimed for agricultural purposes. It is expected the land will turn out to be the most productive in Kent County.
