IN LEGAL CIRCLES.


Toronto Railway Issues a Writ Against East Toronto Council to Obtain Access to Main Station. Mrs. Susanna McLaughlin of Summerville is suing the Toronto Railway Co. and the Toronto and Mimico Electric Railway Co. for \$20,000 damages for the death of her husband, who was killed by a trolley car on the cedar path near the Humber about a year ago. E. R. C. Clarkson, as assignee of the Sampson-Kennedy estate, is seeking to have Henry Gouling declared a partner in the late firm of McClelland & Co. The Sampson-Kennedy Co. estate is a creditor, and Mr. Gouling advanced large amounts of money to Mr. McClelland. It is claimed he should rank as a partner. James Bonner is appealing to have Judge Morrison's decision in the Magan arbitration set aside. The Toronto Railway Co. yesterday issued a writ against the corporation of East Toronto to compel the consent of the people to the extension of the line to the park.

Business Embarrassments. Lacey & McKenry, dry goods, Nanapanee, are offering to compromise at \$200 on the dollar. The liabilities are \$31,000 and assets \$22,000. The offer will probably be accepted. A second and final dividend of 54 per cent. has been declared on the estate of Messrs. Macobe, Robertson & Co., Toronto, and will be payable on the 15th. The total liabilities amounted to \$14,000. The first dividend was 24 per cent., so that creditors are receiving 78 per cent. on their claims. At a meeting of the creditors of Charles Donald, general store, Toronto, a statement was presented showing liabilities of \$2500 and assets of \$2000. Mr. H. Dunlop was appointed assignee, and a compromise was agreed upon. The creditors of Messrs. Dupont & Wilson, general store, Windsor, have been offered 60c on the dollar by Mr. H. Dunlop. As the latter's security was not considered satisfactory, the offer was refused. Mr. H. Wilson offered 20c on the dollar, secured, and this is to be submitted to the creditors. S. M. Osborne, general store, Fleisherton, is offering his claims 40c on the dollar. Messrs. Atchells & Co., general store, Toronto, has assigned to W. H. Hill. The balance in possession of the business of Richard Black, Toronto, is being sold by R. S. Southam, merchant tailor, Yonge-street, who is offering to compromise with his creditors.
