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THE SCOTCH CONCERT.
The annual Scotch recital—mostly Scotch—by the Caledonian Choir, under the direction of Mr. A. T. Cringan, held last night in the Grand Opera House, was a very great success. It is delightful to watch a Scotch choir, and the Caledonian Choir is one of the best in the world. The principals are among the best-known and ablest in the musical profession, and headed on the one side by Amanda Fabris, the prima-donna soprano, whose long and grand voice and whose superb voice and commanding presence particularly qualified her for the role of Frisco's friend; while Mr. Eugene, the Brian Horn of the opera, has earned his reputation and position in the opera world on both sides of the Atlantic. Besides the principals, there is a chorus of fifty, and the same production that achieved such success in New York will be given here on Saturday afternoon.

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
