Nussulman Troops Mutiny. Canea, Island of Crete, March 2.— The Mussulman gendarmes demanded their arrears of pay this atternoon and then revolted, fired shots and threat-ened to provoke a massacre. The for-eign marines ware summoned, and surrounded the barracks of the gen-darmes and fired volleys under the windows as a warning. The gendarmes did not reply. The town was thrown into a state of pank. Later details of the rioting show that the colonel of the gendarmes, Suleiman Bey, was wounded by the mutimeers and is dying. Several other Turkish officers were wounded. The Italian marines fired upon the gendarmes, wounding several of them. The re-mainder at 5 p.m. began to yield. They will be disarmed and put in iroms.
