



The Province of Ontario used to pay 4 per cent interest (or wages) for the money it borrowed. Today wages for money have gone up, just as wages for labor have, so that the province must now pay a wage of over 6 per cent for the money it hires.

Should not that money have wages at least equal to those paid by the Province of Ontario, since the province's borrowings are secured by all property in Ontario, while the street railway's borrowings are secured only by track and equipment?
