following resolution, in the form of conclusions arrived at:


Firstly, That the Prohibition Act of New Brunswick is not being enforced as the promises made during the election campaign in 1925 and confirmed by the present government since coming into power led us to expect;

Secondly, Believing the honorable Secondly, Believing the honorable premier and his colleagues to be men of honor and gentlemen who hold their word sacred, so that when it was publicly stated that the officials in charge of this important function should have a free hand so that they wight act for the strictest enforcement of the Prohibition Act;

Thirdly, That from evidence apparent many things go to prove, that from ome reasons unknown to the public violations of the law, even when charged, fall short of conviction and due punishment, encouraging other violations to continue in their evil riolations to continue in their evil course, this bringing dishonor to the act and discouragement to those who are trying to do their duty in office; Therefore, We as members of the Grand Division, now in session in the City of Moncton, would at this time voice our dissatisfaction with present conditions and our regrets that the promises referred to have not, as far as is evident, been honorably carried out to those who so confidently looked the carry government for the strictest to those who so confidently looked to the new government for the strictest enforcement of the law. Where there is any improvement, and where the law is in any part of the province be-ing enforced we will gladly give the credit to those deserving and would rejoice as temperance voters, men and women, when the government will do its utmost to prove the efficiency of this Prohibition Act throughout our province, for we need no better law if it is honestly and fearlessly enforced.


