Werden, Germany. May 9.—Dr. Krupp Von Bohlen, head of the Krupp Works, and his three directors, Bruhne, Oesterlen and Hartwig heard their sentences in the Werden jail last night. The penalties totalled imprisonment aggregating 55 years, the French court martial having convicted them of responsibility for the conflicts between he Krupp workmen and a French aguad of soldiers on March 31 last which resulted in the death of four-teen workers.
