"Many British manufacturers consulted me as to the establishment of branch plants in Canada. The majority of manufacturers will undoubtedly find it profitable to continue production in the United Kingdom, exporting to Canada. In certain lines, however, their only hope of securing business here is to build plants here and this I advised them to do."
