

MARINE NOTES.

The three masted schooner F. C. Lockhart has been chartered by J. Willard Smith from Walton, N. S., to New York with plaster at \$5.50, free loading and discharge. She is at present in this port and will sail as soon as weather conditions are favorable.

J. Willard Smith has also chartered the schooner C. Maud Gaskill to load hardwood staves at Savannah for Funchal, Madeira, for a lump sum of \$14,000. She is at present en route from England to Key West for orders. Captain Granville of this city is in command.

The three masted schooner Ononette, owned by J. Willard Smith, has been chartered to load fertilizer at Baltimore for Martinique on private terms. She is at present en route from Windsor to New York with a cargo of plaster.

The S. S. Wimborn sailed from Sydney, C. B., yesterday for this port to load a cargo of grain for the continent.

The barkentine Skandia cleared yesterday for the River Mersey with 176-840 feet of spruce deals. George McKean & Co., Ltd. are the local agents. The Portugese schooner, Oceana, which sailed from St. John on October 23 for Lisbon, Spain, was abandoned on November 6, owing to the heavy Atlantic storm in latitude 39.19 north and longitude 58.35 west. The crew were taken off by the steamer Atlantic City sailing from Brixham to Hampton Roads. The Oceana loaded here with a cargo of lumber from the Stetson, Cutler mills and the local agents are Nagle & Wigmore. The position named is considerably north of the schooner's course to Lisbon which would indicate that she had been driven out of her course.
