

LEAGUE OF NATIONS AT THE CONFERENCE

Paris, Jan. 31.—(By the Associated Press).—While the supreme council of powers was occupied today with some of the lesser controversies—those in the Balkans and Poland—the chief business was in private conference as a sequel to the decision on the German colonies.

Having accepted the American plan for supervision of the colonies by the League of Nations, it has now become necessary to give body and substance to a League of Nations in order that it may perform the important tasks which are committed to its care. This is regarded as the chief business immediately ahead, and President Wilson is giving it his main attention.

Two premiers, of Roumania and Serbia, M. Bratianu and M. Pachitch, were heard by the council today, on the boundary question lying between them. It developed that another secret treaty was signed in August, 1916, as a condition of Roumania's entry into the war, under which Roumania was holding all the territory within designated river boundaries.

Although the hearings showed a sharp difference in views, there is reason to believe that mutual concessions will lead

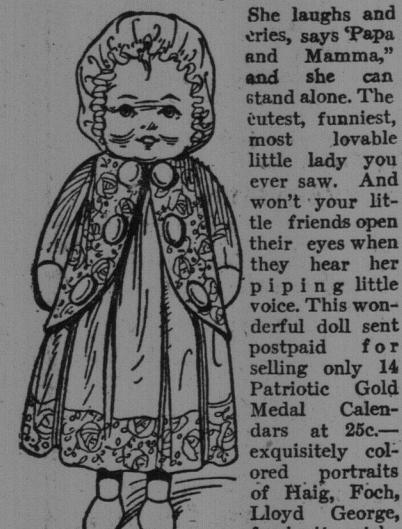

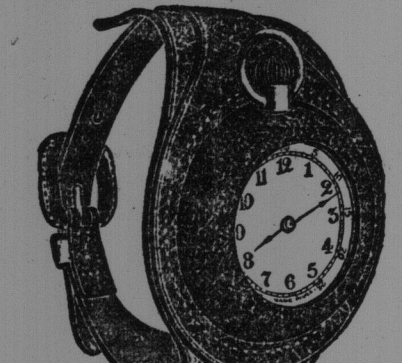

EXECUTIVE PLANS FOR WAR SAVING SOCIETIES

A meeting presided over by R. W. Wigmore, M. P., was held last evening at the war savings stamp headquarters in Prince William street to organize an executive committee of the War Savings Society. The following gentlemen were named: Retail Merchants, C. H. Smythe; Trades and Labor Council, A. E. Saunders; Board of Trade, J. M. Christie; Life Underwriters, F. C. McLean. Representatives of the manufacturers and commercial travelers will be appointed later.

Each branch of trade and the various associations, such as the Great War Veterans and Trades and Labor Council, will be organized by its representative on the executive, and a chairman, secretary and treasurer will be appointed for each. The different branches of the retail trade will be called together and addressed by the member of the executive.

Mr. Wigmore and Mr. Smythe are to interview the merchants on Monday morning for the purpose of selecting a man in each branch of trade to take charge of the stamp campaign.

Each trade union is being asked to organize a society on lines similar to those of the merchants. Each society will receive a government certificate showing that it is authorized to handle the stamps.

Secretary Berry reports that the campaign is progressing very favorably throughout the city.

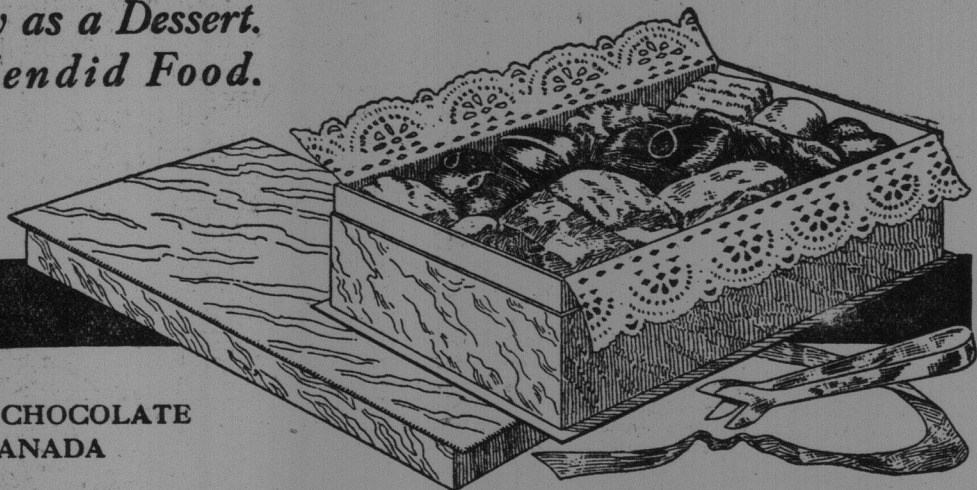
