A LITTLE CREPE COAT.



Open wide the material and arrange along one edge the underfacing (C), the back sleeve and front yoke (B) and front (A). The skirts can be cut from one end and the belt from the other edge. Now take a fold of the crepe about 3 inches wide and place on this the collar (D). Pin all in place carefully and cut.

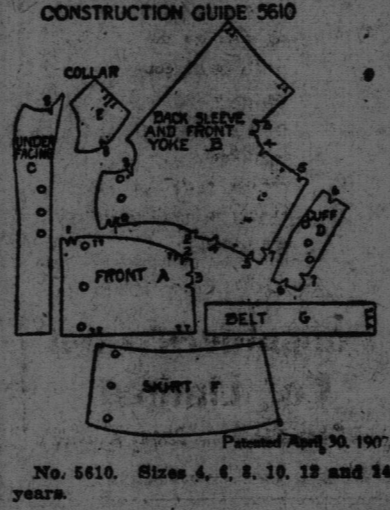
The front of the coat is now gathered at the upper and lower edges; also gather lower edge of back between double "T" perforations. Sew yoke to upper edge of front as notched, center; also large "O" perforations indicate center-front. Close under-arm and sleeve seams as notched; close center-back seam. Close cuff seam as notched; sew to lower edge of long sleeve, notches and button even. Large "O" perforations in skirt indicate center-front; close back seam, sew to lower edge of front and back, center even. Adjust underfacing to position underneath front of coat, corresponding edges even. Adjust belt, center even. Sew collar to neck edge as notched. If desired, roll collar and front on single small "O" perforations. For the adjustment, fancy buttons are suggested, and with these may be combined narrow loops of fancy braid. The coat is suitably effective carried out in soft silk. It also looks well in tub materials, but the gathered effect makes the problem of laundering a difficult one.

White or light gray crepe de chine may be used for this coat, with striped silk as a trimming. It has a stylish shoulder yoke effect and may be further ornamented with fancy buttons and braid.

Heavy quality crepe de chine is used for this dressy little spring coat, which is sure to find high favor throughout the season. The back, sleeve and front yoke are cut in one piece, and the trimming is carried out in striped silk or satin. Quite a practical idea, too, is to have belt, collar and cuffs of the coat material, with fancy collar, etc., of linen or embroidery.

To make the coat coats: 3 1/2 yards 36-inch material at 21 cent. \$3.94 1/2 yard contrasting material 1/4 inch wide at 25 cent. 1.50

If 44-inch material is used, 3 yards will be required.
