THE PATRIOTIC FUND

Lansdowne Ward Contributes More Than \$1,200—Other Generous Contributions

The total of the St. John Patriotic Fund collected to date is \$16,072.84, and in addition \$2,500 has been subscribed but not yet paid in.

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RELIEVING THE ONTARIO UNEMPLOYED

The steps the Ontario Department of Agriculture is taking toward relieving unemployment in the cities of the province this fall and winter are explained by Hon. James Duff.

"There are," said Hon. Mr. Duff, "many farmers who have been unable to hire help during the winter months because of the high wages asked, but who might be glad to engage extra help if they could secure it on the basis of smaller wages. Then we are told that in the cities and towns there are very many, some inexperienced and some partially experienced in farm work, who would prefer to take almost any wage which included board for a few months, rather than depend on city charity."

"The department," he continued, "will make an effort to see what extent these two classes exist and how they may be brought together. We are by advertising and through our district representatives and by other means endeavoring to ascertain the names of farmers who would be glad to utilize help labor on this basis during the next few months. We will then be in a position to state how many men can be taken care of in this way. Our whole organization is being devoted to this matter and will be at the disposal of those interested in the subject."
