DIVORCE EVIL UP IN ANGLICAN CONVENTION

American House of Deputies Favors International Congress To Discuss it—Religious Training in Public Schools

New York, Oct. 21—The divorce question came up in the general convention of the Protestant Episcopal church today, the house of deputies by resolution deciding to co-operate with the "International Committee on Marriage and Divorce" in arranging for an international congress to deal with the subject. The congress is to be held in May, 1916, at the Panama Pacific exposition in San Francisco for the purpose, in the language of the resolution, "of awakening the conscience of the American people towards the great evil of divorce and remarriage." The resolution was adopted without opposition. After adopting the marriage and divorce resolution, the deputies took favorable action on a resolution introduced several days ago by the Rev. Dr. Freeman, deputy from Minnesota, intended to further religious training in the public schools. The resolution instructs the general board of religious education to "effect, if possible, through co-operation with other religious bodies, a system of instruction commensurate with the needs of our youth, together with forms and exercises calculated to promote patriotism, and the highest sense of personal integrity and purity of life." The general board is instructed, as a means to this end, "to take prompt action to promote the daily reading of a portion of the Holy Scriptures in all public schools." Both this resolution and that on marriage and divorce must be concurred in by the house of bishops before becoming effective. The committee on the prayer book reported favorably on the proposal that the phrase "all Jews, Turks, heathens and infidels" be made to read: "all those who know Thee not through the Gospel of Thy Son." The house voted favorably on this change as recommended by its committee.

AS IF AGAINST A STONE WALL

Nova Scotia Fishermen and Their Treatment By Borden Government

(Halifax Chronicle) The fishermen of Nova Scotia, especially those who will within a few weeks be preparing for the lobster fishing, are butting against a stone wall when they ask the Borden government for relief from the oppressive duties upon rope and other accessories of their industry. Rope is the one important essential for the lobstering business, and one of the most difficult to procure at a profitable price. Manila hemp rope is the kind almost altogether used, but last year owing to the burning, by a long drought, of the crop in the Philippine Islands, the only producer of that particular grade of hemp in the world, Manila hemp rope, the grade purchased in Nova Scotia by Shelburne, Queens and Yarmouth for use in their gear has advanced \$100 per ton during the last eighteen months. Made a Substitute This rope is admitted into Canada free of duty if used only for lobster fishing. In view of the increased cost and the great scarcity of the article, one of the largest manufacturers of this rope in the United States and Canada experimented with various grades of fibre, aiming to make some rope that would contain qualities equally as good as the manila hemp and thereby produce a substitute for the fishermen's use, and one that they could purchase at a lower cost. This rope, selling at \$60 a ton lower than the present price of manila, was shipped to their Halifax salesman from their New England factory with every expectation that it would be admitted on the same basis, that is, duty free, of the manila hemp rope for which it is a substitute.

Imposed the Duty But such expectation was not realized. The company's Halifax representative took up the matter with the customs department at Ottawa, believing that when the facts of the distress entailed upon the fishermen by the manila hemp rope and the substitute for it when sold to the fishermen, which he would have saved, must now go to swell the surplus of the government exchequer. The relief which the fishermen might have obtained through the substitute article is practically made negligible by this obstinate action of the custom department.

Has Canadian Branch The concern manufacturing this article has a large Canadian branch in Ontario, which branch largely supplied the Nova Scotia market, therefore the article was not looked upon as an American product. In view of having this substitute manila rope manufactured by a certain Canadian branch it would, by some, be considered of little importance whether this duty would go into effect or not. But even having the alternative of buying from a Canadian factory the same article which the New England houses was producing at the same price is altogether negated by the increased rates over the I. C. R. to Halifax, the distributing centre of Nova Scotia. The inconsistency of the whole situation is shown by the fact that the government, claiming that pure Philippine manila rope to be used only for lobstering will be admitted free of duty, is admitting free of duty, under the name of manila rope, another rope which is a "mongrel breed," a composition of many fibres, some of them grown in New Zealand, and others in foreign countries, the smallest proportion of the composition being of manila hemp. This article is manufactured by the same people, but it is not practical for lobstering purposes. What is the Reason? The question has naturally arisen what is behind the blind obstinacy of the

Daily Hints For the Cook

Lamb Soup Cook 2 lbs lamb in cold water until tender. Remove meat and reserve 1/2 cup of the broth to be used in making Bechamel sauce. Then add an onion, carrots, barley, thickening and seasoning to taste. Virginia Mince-meat Two pounds of cold beef chopped very fine, 1 pound of suet chopped fine, 5 pounds of apples pared and chopped, 3 pounds of brown sugar, 2 pounds of raisins seeded and chopped, 1 pound of seedless raisins, 2 pounds of currants, 1 pound of citron shredded, 2 tablespoons each of cinnamon and mace, 1 tablespoon each of cloves, allspice and salt, 1 quart of sherry and 1 pint of brandy. Mix the ingredients and let it stand three weeks before using. The juice of spiced fruit or preserves may be added when making the pies.

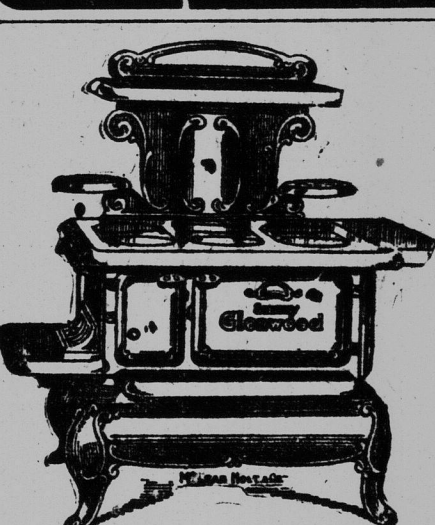
