To hear concerts, new bulletins and other features thrown onto the air by broadcasting stations of Seattle, thirty miles from here, Everett radio fans, who also are telephone subscribers, will simply hook their radio receiving sets onto the attachment, which is known as the radio adapter, and which will fit into the telephone bell box. Expensive aerials and wiring will not be needed.

In addition to supplying the adapter, the telephone company, working with the Seattle Radio Association, will mail to its radio subscribers weekly programmes of the broadcasting stations and will collect \$5 a year from each fan to defray the cost. The Seattle association hopes to have telephones in all other cities within a radius of 100 miles, equipped with the adapter.
