Twenty minutes later John Farman came into the house and said he had killed Foote with a club. Mrs. Foote went and saw her husband's bleeding body lying in the stall. He was dead. His head had been battered out of all semblance to humanity. Furman afterwerds went away, but! returned Friday and set fire to the barn to destroy the evidence of the crime.
