WHERAS it is provided by the 58th Section of the Act 31 Victoria, Chapter 6, intituled "An Acc respecting the Customs," that the importer of any cattle or swine may slaughter and cure and pack the same in bond, under such Regulations and restrictions as the Governor in Council may from time to time make for this purpose.

And whereas it has been found expedient to give effect to the said Section 58, in so far as regards the importation of swine, and to at ter the terms of the Regulations for this purpose, adopted by Order in Council of 22nd of May, 1868;—
His Excellency, on the recommendation of the donorable the Minister of Customs and underthe provisions of the said Act has been pleased to ender, and it is hereby ordered, that the said Order in Council of the 22nd day of May, 1868; and the Regulations thereby establised to and the same are hereby repealed, and that the following Regulations to and are hereby adopted and established in lieu thereof—that is to say.

1. Upon the importation of swine for the purpose of slaughter, the Importer shall enter the same for Warehouse, upon the usual form of such entiries, stating upon its face, the number and value of the herd, and also, the quantity of pork, bacon, hamb and lard, which the ...mber stated will produce when slaughtered and dressed at 118 pounds weight for each live hog so imported, and the amount of duty to which such produce is er may be liable under the rate prescribed by the tariff in force, at the time being as the proper duty on meat of that kind. Such Importer shall then execute a bond to the Queen, in double the semont of such duty, the condition of which head shall be, that upon the due exportation within one year of the sald products of the swine so imported and converted into pork, becom, hams and lard, or pa ment of the duty secured by the said bond, then the sald bond shall be and become null and void, otherwise shall remain in full force and virtue.
