Victory For Prohibition

The St. Barbe District Count is finished, and the result is 1069 for Prohibition and 497 against. This is only 1 vote short of the 40 p.c. required from the district. The Prohibitionists had to get 24,581 votes, and they have secured 24,965, which gives a majority for Prohibition of 384.

Those who labored so hard and so incessantly to make Prohibition a success are delighted with the result. Our joy in this locality at least is subdued by the anxiety regarding the fate of those on board the missing schr. Swallow.

Crew of Annie Rescued

Landed at Fermanagh—Cape Race—Search for the Blanche M. Rose.

The little schooner Annie was rescued from the Cape Race coast on Sunday morning and was taken to the Cape Race wharf by the Cape Race tugboat. The crew of the Annie, consisting of 35 men and boys, were brought to the Cape Race wharf on Sunday morning. The schooner was bound for the Cape Race wharf, and was in search of the Blanche M. Rose.

Arrived at Fermanagh at 4.30 p.m.; took crew of Annie of Red Island off steamer Monadnock, bound for London, 35 miles south-east of Cape Race; crew all well; wind south; very thick.

The Annie's crew must have had a hard experience as at the time that the schooner was taken in tow by the Sealac the three men on board were in an almost exhausted condition and their subsequent stay on the boat gave them no time for rest. It is to be hoped that the Cape Race search for the Blanche M. Rose will result successfully. The Monadnock which took off the Annie's crew is a ship of over 4,000 tons gross and is owned by Andrew Ware & Co., of Glasgow, whether she was bound from Montreal. A message from Cape Race today to the fisheries Department says that no schooners have been reported there.—Herald, Nov. 25.

Ayr Military Parade

Everyone seemed to be satisfied on Saturday with the appearance made by the soldiers who marched through our streets. They were a numerous body. Their physique was, on the whole, good, and the majority of them had the appearance of seasoned troops. The transformation which can be effected by drill, discipline and the open air life is a wonderful one. The men of the Newfoundland regiment attracted a great deal of attention, chiefly from the fact that they have travelled far in the interests of their King and Country. A finer set of fellows it would be difficult to find. Amongst them are many stalwarts—tall, big boned young men. This compliment is due to the Newfoundlanders, without all detracting from the physique and general fitness of the other soldiers who took part in the parade. The appearance of the Newfoundland regiment was another proof of the solidarity of the British empire. When the Motherland is in danger her colonies and dependencies can be relied upon to come to her aid by contributing handsomely in men, and money, and in other ways. Canada has done splendidly, and her sons who are in our midst deserve our thanks for what they have done. So far, the practical result of the rally in Ayr has not been made public, but it is to be hoped it was of a satisfactory character.

A Big Fire

Fradsham & Co's Premises Totally Destroyed

On Friday night, Nov. 19th, about 8 o'clock a fire broke out in the premises of Fradsham & Co. who occupied under lease the large store and inn belonging to the late Capt. Isaac Mercer. Fortunately for the property holders of Bay Roberts the wind was blowing from a northerly direction and toward the harbor, the wind continuing in this direction during the continuance of the blaze. Had the wind been blowing from an easterly or a westerly point there is every likelihood that considerable other property would have been destroyed.

At this writing the origin of the fire is unknown. It is said that it broke out at the rear of the building. It was no time before the building was a mass of flames and at least not with the fire fighting appliances available in Bay Roberts, nothing could be done to save it, at least not with the fire fighting appliances available in Bay Roberts. A schooner owned by the company was at the wharf, but the lines were quickly let go and the vessel was removed to safety. Only a few things were saved out of the store. In less than a couple of hours the whole structure, including the little office to the west of the main building, was entirely consumed.

It is reported that the building and stock was held under mortgage by Geo. M. Barr of St. John's. The stock and premises were insured in the Hartford Fire Insurance Co., Barr being the agent for Newfoundland.

A preliminary enquiry into the fire is being conducted by Judge Oke to-day (Friday).
