## GREEKS WIN DOUBLE HEADER FROM BANGOR

Yesterday was ideal weather for baseball and over two thousand fans turned out at the morning and afternoon games on the Marathon grounds and witnessed the Greeks win a double header from the Bangor team. In the morning game the Bangor team was shut out while the Marathons made four runs. In the afternoon the Marathons won by a score of six to two.

Something must have happened in the Greek camp for this team showed considerable more ginger than they did in their game a few days ago against Calais, but they are far from perfect yet, and may be expected to round into better shape when the rough edges of early season playing is worn off. It was Bangor's first appearance in this city and while they put up a pretty good article of ball they did not play as good a game as the Greeks.

A thousand people were present at the morning exhibition, which was played in an hour and 24 minutes. There was not a single error on the part of the Marathons. The pitcher, it was Joe's first appearance in a game here this season and he was given a grand ovation as he went to the box.

If there is anything in the Indian signs to count on, certainly put the Apohaki dazlers on the State of Maine in this game. He made it a Greek from start to finish. It was until the fifth inning that anything resembling a hit was made off his delivery. Labreck, the Bangor first baseman, was the person to break the spell and then he hit a slow ball to third base which he beat out. He did not last long, however, on first, as he was hit by a line drive from the pitcher.

Two bases on balls, a sacrifice, a wild pitch and two singles gave the Marathons two runs in the first inning. Two hits, a sacrifice and an error gave the Greeks two more runs in the fourth inning and they stopped the scoring for the remainder of the game. AFTERNOON GAME.

There was about 1,500 people present at the afternoon game which proved another victory for the Marathons by a score of six to two. The Marathons were the Marathons pitcher and although wild at times, giving seven bases on balls, he struck seven out and was only found for five hits. His support was good, with the exception of the shortstop, Waterhouse who had a couple of errors but this player made up for these by doing some excellent fielding. The Marathons batted their way to victory. Sarette was the first pitcher to twirl for Bangor and in two and two-thirds innings the Greeks had landed on him for seven safe hits, and these, aided by two sacrifices, an error and a passed ball, however, only netted the Greeks three runs. Captain Magoon batted Sarette and put Hermon in to pitch. The latter kept the Marathons down without scoring until the old seventh inning when with a base on balls, a sacrifice and three singles the Greeks managed to roll in three runs and this finished the scoring. Seven hits were made off Hermon's delivery giving the Marathons a total of 14 hits doing the game. The Bangor men with the aid of Hermon's bases on balls managed to fill the bases in the last inning and made matters rather exciting for a short time but Shankley settled down and the side was retired hitting out to the infield.
