Presbyterians all—A Happy New Year to you!

The Presbyterian Church in Canada has adopted a budget for 1917 of \$1,000,000 to adequately carry on the missionary work to which she has laid her hand, at home and abroad.

The statistical report submitted to the last Assembly and covering the year 1916, shows 1,003 self-sustaining Presbyterian congregations, 331 augmented charges, 255 ordained mission fields, 533 student mission fields, and in all 4,603 preaching stations.

The same report gives 181,493 families, 49,879 individuals not connected with families, and a communicant roll of 335,457.
