President Wilson, at Dinner Given President-Elect Pessoa, of Brazil in Paris, Declares Idea is Outgrowth of Bonds Between North and South American Nations.

Paris, May 26.—(By The Associated Press)—Speaking at a dinner given Monday night by the Pan-American League...

President Wilson's Address. "The honor has been accorded me," President Wilson said, "of making the first speech tonight and I am very glad to avail myself of that privilege."

"I am particularly glad to have the opportunity of paying my respects to Mr. Pessoa. It is very delightful for me to know that his presidency is ahead of him. I wish him every happiness and every success with the greatest earnestness and yet I cannot, if I may judge by my own experience, expect for him a very great exaltation in the performance of the duties of his office because, after all, to be the head of an American state is a task of unrelenting responsibility."

American Ideals Are Now Justified. "I suppose no more delicate task is given any man than to interpret the feelings and the purposes of a great people. I know that if I may speak for myself, the chief anxiety I have had has been to be the true interpreter of a national spirit, expressing no private and peculiar views but trying to express the general spirit of a nation."
