Will Load at Windsor.
The schooner Jeremiah Smith has been thoroughly overhauled and is now at McAvity's wharf, ready to sail. She will load lumber at Windsor for an American port.

Pilot Boat Repaired.

En Route to This Port.
The S. S. Lake St. John sailed from Quebec Friday morning for this port to load lumber for the continent. J. T. Knight & Co. are the local agents.

Cunard Skipper Retires.
Captain W. T. Turner of the Cunard Line, who was master of the Lusitania when she was sunk by the Hun on May 7, 1915, has retired, after fifty years of seafaring. He was master of the Mauretania when she made her unequalled round-trip record of twelve days from Liverpool to New York and several ships of the General Line which fell prey to the enemy submarines.

Fryatt's Ship Afloat.
Captain Fryatt's ship, the S. S. Brussels, was recently raised at Zeebrugge, and is now being repaired by the Germans before their evacuation, and has been so well repaired that it is in condition to be towed anywhere. She was a German prize, but the authorities regard her as the property of the Belgian government.

High Freight Rate.
The new steamer Audrey P. Brown, Capt. Ralph Brown, is under charter for her maiden voyage to carry coal from Sydney to St. John's, Nfld., at \$4.75 per ton, and dry shillings at the regular profit rate.

The Longshoremen's Strike.
An indication of the effect the longshoremen's strike has had on the port of New York was shown in shipping records of the port up to noon Wednesday, disclosing that 625 vessels, of which 540 are steamships, are tied up. Of the steamships, 53 are passenger vessels, among them being some of the largest liners afloat. Many of the idle ships are costing their owners from \$500 to \$1,000 a day in dock rental.

Heavy Produce Traffic.
Owing to the heavy shipments of potatoes and other produce from Prince Edward Island to other parts of the Maritime Provinces and the New England States, it is necessary for the Island car-ferry to make from three to four trips each day. At present recently there were 45 car loads of produce awaiting transportation.

Cleared For Genuegos.
The American tern schooner Georgina D. Jenkins, well known at this port, has cleared for Bridgewater for Genuegos with a large cargo of lumber.

Bunkers Were Afire.


