

PARLIAMENT OF CANADA.

Special to the Tribune. A Strong Case against the Sitting Member for South Renfrew—The New Brunswick School Question to be Opened up—Lady Dufferin's Reception.

OTTAWA, March 13. A petition was presented to Parliament yesterday setting forth the following allegations in reference to the election in South Renfrew, and praying that the Returning Officer be summoned to the bar of the House to answer the charges, to wit:

The townships of Hagarty, Sherwood, Jones, Burns and Richards were added by the Representation Bill to the constituency of South Renfrew, no provision being made for taking the votes of the electors therein, nor for administering oaths to electors in the manner provided in other unorganized districts when there are no assessment rolls.

The bill to legalize assessments in Woodstock was agreed to. The bill to incorporate the St. George Red Grant Co. was objected to by Hon. Mr. Willis and Mr. Maher because it exempts the property from taxation, and progress was reported on it.

Beckwith, Robinson, Fraser and Butler presented petitions praying for the incorporation of the Loyal Orange Association. Hon. Mr. White introduced a bill relating to the municipality of the County of Carleton, and a petition to further the object of the same; Mr. Brown, a bill to erect part of the parish of St. Stephen into a separate town or parish, also a petition to further the object of the same; Mr. Maher presented a numerously signed petition from Roman Catholics of Carleton and Portland, St. John, praying the amendment of the Schools Act.
