CHICAGO, March 25 .- The greates nan-hunt in the history of Chicago was extended to cover the entire central west today in the search for "Tommy" O'Connor, who on Wednesday night shot his way to liberty through a cordon of policemen, killing Detective Sergeant Patrick O'Neill.

With orders to shoot to kill, more than 2,500 patrolmen are searching the city. Rifle squads have been sent to surrounding towns. Hand-bills putting a price of \$2,500 on his head "dead or alive," were sent throughout Illinois, Iowa and Wisconsin.




