Speaker of Senate.—Hon. WILLIAM MILLER, *Apptd.* 17 Oct., 1883.)

Clerk of the Senate and of the Parliaments.—EDOUARD JOSEPH LANGEVIN. Fourth s. of the late Jean Langevin, Esq., of the City of Quebec, and a brother of His Lordship the Bishop of Rimouski, and of Hon. Sir Hector L. Langevin, K.C.M.G. B. in Quebec in 1833. Ed. at the Quebec Seminary. M., 1877. Marie Charlotte Elizabeth, second dau. of Hon. James Armstrong, C.M.G., late Chief Justice of St. Lucia and Tobago, West Indies. Admitted as a Notary, L.C., 3 Dec. 1858, and was for some years a mem. of the Chamber of Notaries for the dist. of Quebec. Served as a volunteer officer during the "Trent" affair, became Major of the 9th Batt. Vol. Mil. or *Volontiers de Quebec*, and retired retaining rank, 1865. *Apptd.* Clerk of the Crown in Chancery, Can., 4 Jan., 1865; to same office for the Dominion, 5 July, 1867; Deputy Registrar General, 1 July, 1868; Under Secretary of State of Can., 9 July, 1873. *Apptd.* Secy. of the Civil Service Board, 1876. *Apptd.* Clerk of the Senate, 25 Jan., 1883. (*Salary*, \$3,400.)—47 Slater Street: *Parliament House*.

Clerk Assistant, and Master in Chancery.—JAMES ADAMSON. Eld-est s. of the late Rev. William Agar Adamson, D.D., in his lifetime Chaplain and Librarian of the L. C. of Can. B. at Birr, King's Co., Irel., 15 Oct., 1826. M. 3 Jan., 1863, Mary Julia, dau. of the late Stewart Derbyshire, Esq., Quebec. Came to Canada in 1841. Entered the service of the L. C. of Can. 1842, and continued therein until July, 1867, when he was transferred to the service of the Senate as Clerk of the Journals. Promoted to present position 11 May, 1882, and *apptd.* Master in Chancery 27 June, 1882. Called to the Bar L. C., 1856; a Capt. in the militia 1848, and a Commr. to administer the oath of allegiance to members of the Senate, 31 Jan., 1883.—215 Metcalfe Street.

Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod.—RENÉ EDWARD KIMBER. B. in Three Rivers, P.Q., 24 Jan., 1846. M., 8 Nov., 1879, Louise, widow of the late H. O. Burritt, Esq., of Ottawa (she d.). Called to the Bar, L. C., 1867; to that of U.C. in Easter Term, 1869; *apptd.* to present office (on the retirement of his father), 4 June, 1875.
