
 QUESTIONS PASSED IN THE NEGATIVE—*Continued.*

30. That the Bill to consolidate and amend the several acts respecting Insurance, in so far as regards Fire and Inland Marine business, be re-committed with instruction so to amend it that \$100,000 be deposited as security with the Receiver General, 245.
31. That the Bill respecting the lien of the Dominion on the Northern Railway of Canada be read that day three months, 248. That it be re-committed with instructions, 249.
32. That the practice of granting Divorces by Act of Parliament is for many reasons objectionable, &c., 263.
33. That the Bill respecting Insolvency be re-committed to a Committee of the Whole House, &c., 277-283.

34. That the establishment of the Supreme Court (for reasons set forth in a Resolution proposed in amendment to the motion for the Speaker to leave the Chair,) is not *now* desirable, &c., 292. That the Bill be read a third time that day six months, 304. That it be re-committed with instructions, 305-312.
35. That the Bill providing for the construction of a railway from Esquimaux to Nanaimo be read a second time that day three months, 297. That it be re-committed for the purpose of adding the words: "Provided always that any such contract shall have the previous approval of Parliament," 299.
36. That it is desirable that steps should be taken to ascertain the feasibility and the cost of adapting the Welland Canal to vessels drawing 14 feet of water, etc., 313.
37. That the Resolution reported from Committee of Supply, providing \$3,562.50, to pay to the Hon. D. A. Smith, M.P., a sum advanced by him, be not concurred in, 337.
38. That this House regrets that contracts have been made by the Government for the construction of a line of telegraph from Lake Superior to Cash Creek, before the location of the line of the Canadian Pacific Railway has been determined upon, 345. That certain words be added to the foregoing motion, *ibid.*
39. That the consideration of the approval of a contract with Messrs. Sifton & Ward, for the construction of a certain part of the Canadian Pacific R.R. be postponed, 350.

QUESTIONS OF FORM AND ORDER:

40. It having been moved to add the following words to a motion for concurrence in the report of the Committee of Supply: "That out of the sum to be set apart for the benefit of the Menonites, a proportionate sum be assigned towards inducing native Canadians residing in the United States to settle in Manitoba or the North-West Territory," Mr. Speaker ruled that he must decline to put the amendment inasmuch as it proposed to change the destination of a grant recommended by the Crown, 140.
