Hispaniarum Regem Catholicum, &c. Eorumque Haredes ac Successores, Regna, & Subditos, per Pacificationis Tractatum, Trajecti ad Rhenum die Seeundo Mensis Julii, novissime prateriti, conclusum, in eam praprimis Curam iverunt Regia sua Majestates, ut mutuis Subditorum suorum in re Commerciorum Utilitatibus omni meliori modo prospiceretur; & proptereà Legatis suis Extraordinariis & Plenipotentiariis, quorum Opera in Pace pangendâ prospere successit, in Mandatis clementissime dederunt, ut que in Finem hunc Salutarem, post perpensa rerum omnium Momenta in Colloquiis ea de re Madriti babitis, maximè convenire perspectum fuerat, in Tractatús Commerciorum selennis formam redigerent; Disti igitur Legati, vigorePlenipotentiarum, quarum Apographa sub Finem bujus Instrumenti verbo tenus inserta erunt, super Commerciarum Articulis, ad Elucidationem Tractatuum anteriorum, & procurandam uberiorem in Commerciorum negotiis expediendis Facilitatem, modo & forma convenerunt, prout sequitur:

Ra Catus Pacis, Commerciorum, & Confæderationis, inter Coronas Magnæ Britanniæ & Hispaniæ, Madriti die Decimo tertio Mensis Maii, Anno Domini 1667, conclusus, per hunc Tractatum ratihahetur & confirmatur, eundémque, una cum Schedulis Regiis, sive Ordinationibus eidem annexis, ad majus Robur & Tutamen, de verbo ad verbum hic loci inserere placuit, prout sequitur:

Fifth, by the Grace of God, Catholick King of Spain, &c. and their Heirs and Successors, Kingdoms, and Subjects, by a Treaty of Pacification concluded at Ucrecht the Second Day of the Month of July last past, their Majesties before all things made it their Care, that the mutual Advantage of their Subjects in matters of Trade might be provided for after the best manner; and therefore they most Gracionsly gave Instructions to their Ambassadors Extraordinary and Plenipotentiaries, (by whose means the Peace had been happily concluded) to draw up into a Solemn Treaty of Commerce, what soever, after all things had been throughly considered at the Conferences held for that purpose at Madrid, should seem to conduce most to this good End; The said Ambassadors therefore, by virtue of their full Powers, (Copies whereof are inserted word for word at the End of this Instrument ) a. greed upon Articles of Commerce for the Explanation of former Treaties, and greater Ease and Convenience of Trade, in the Manner and Form following:

THE Treaty of Peace, Commerce, and Alliance, concluded at Madrid between the Crowns of Great Britain and Spain the 13/23 Day of May, 1667. is Ratified and Confirmed by this Treaty, and for the greater Strengthening and Confirmation of the same, it has been thought proper to insert it word for word in this place, together with the Royal Schedules or Ordinations annexed to it, as follows:
