CHAP. XIII.

An Act to amend and make permanent an Act passed in the fifth year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act to prevent the sale of Spirituous Liquors to Indians."

[Passed 10th February, 1840.]

HEREAS an Act passed in the fifth year of the reign of Preamble.

His late Majesty King William the Francisco His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled, "An [See 5 Wm. Act to prevent the sale of spirituous liquors to Indians," will IV. Ch. 9.] shortly expire, and it is expedient to continue and amend the same: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America,' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province," and by the authority of the same, That from and after the passing of this Act, it No kind of shall not be lawful for any person to sell, barter, exchange or spirituous give to any Indian man, woman or child, within this Province, sold, bartered, any kind of spirituous liquors in any manner or way, or to exchanged or cause or procure the same to be done for any purpose what-given, to any ever, under the pains and penalties to be inflicted by the authority of this Act.
