Mississauga by-laws

10,271 — To regulate the use of motorized snow vehicles in public parks in the Town of Mississauga, and to repeal by-law 8377 (This provides for deletion of Jack Darling

Park and the inclusion of the day camp site (Markborough Properties, and repeals the previous by-law regulating the use of snow vehicles in parks.)

10,284 — To authorize execution of a grant of easement. (Easement for watermain purposes in Block E, Plan 878, Bromsgrove Road. Granted to the Town gratuitously by Welgen Limited.)

10,285 — To authorize the construction of roads in Bob-Clare Industrial subdivision, at an estimated total cost of \$307,400 (of which \$302,497 is to be debentured. (Approximately \$4,903 to be withdrawn from the general municipal development reserve fund.)

10,286 — To authorize the construction of storm sewers in Bob-Clare Industrial subdivision at an estimated total cost of \$293,000 (of which \$211,000 is to be debentured.) (\$82,000 is to be allocated from general municipal development reserve fund.)

10,287 — To authorize the construction of sanitary sewers in Bob-Clare Industrial subdivision, at an estimated total cost of \$68,000.

10,288 — To establish certain lands as part of a municipal

highway. (This by-law opens the road allowance running north from Burnhamthorpe Rd. E. to the centre line of the Etobicoke Creek. This road allowance is being closed, so it must first be established as a part of the highway system.)

10,289 — To stop up part of the allowance for road between Lots A and 1, Concession 2, North of Dundas Street in the Town of Mississauga. (This by-law stops up the road allowance located north from Burnhamthorpe Road E. up to the centre line of the Etobicoke Creek — required to be closed as it is no longer required and can now be sold to the abutting owners.)

10,293 — To establish certain lands as part of a municipal highway. (This by-law lifts a one foot reserve (Block M) on Plan 942 to provide access from Sherobee Road to Block D, Plan 942 and establishes Block M as part of Sherobee Road.)

10,294 — To authorize an application to the Ontario Municipal Board for approval of an expenditure in amount of \$300,000 for the construction of and furnishing of an addition to the Clarkson-Lorne Park Library in the Town of Mississauga.
