Dear Mr. Rattenbury:

Your letter of the 10th instant has been received this morning, in the absence of Mr. King, who is at present in Washington attending the sessions of the International Labour Conference as representative of Prince Edward Island.

Your letter states it has been agreed that Mr. A. B. Warburton should act as Vice-President for Prince Edward island. This has been noted, and is all that is needed to complete the representation of your Province on the Committee.

Since the Irovince is entitled to seven representatives altogether (one Vice-President, the Premier or his nominee, and five other members) it will not be necessary to drop the name of Mr. P. N. Pate, as your letter suggests. Unless you advise otherwise, therefore, the list of members from Prince Edward Island will therefore be as follows:
