

Therefore be filed in the Department before Patent for the lot can issue to the latter.

With regard to the Fishing Station on lot 1 & 2 on B, which you state Mr. White purchased from the Indians, there is no record in the Department of his having any right to the same; and any purchase of land made by Indians is contrary to law. The Superintendent General of Indian Affairs is hereby leaving the power of obtaining the consent
