was preparing the grounds for it. He was willing to ccept and Mrs. Boyer called me again while he was nder close arrest and she did not know he had been pprehended and that was at least four or five days
fter his arrest.

- Q.68 You will admit then, Sir, that your alleged knowledge of Boyer's family have influenced you?
- A.68 Have influenced me? In which way?
- Q.69 Your judgment in this particular matter. Statements which you say you admit making?
- A.69 How
- Q.70 From the statements that you appear to admit making, it would seem to be that you have let your judgment be interested in your knowledge of his family affairs and has effected your decisions?
- A.70 What decisions?
- Q.71 Your decisions in respect to his transfer?
- Well, there are two points; first there was no vacancy at the Royal 22e Regt and secondly I was aware of the circumstances of his family and serious attempts were made to transfer him to Montreal by myself and for further facts see in his file a report signed by the Padre.
