- 3.2 M. Harrison and Others In response to a question, ONT indicated that he is keeping in touch with Mr. Harrison, has sent him a copy of the Fowler Report, and while he has no indication of Mr. Harrison's desire to return to the CBC, ONT will endeavour to interest him. MOMT urged all concerned to keep likely prospects in mind either for advancement or for return to Corporation employment.
- ACB indicated that at the recent Job & Wage Analysis Meeting there was discussion of ungrouping of supervisory producers, ACB and CO are to look into the program organizers and others and that question and make recommendations.
- 4. Publicity Rouyn-Timmins Extension P & I indicated that he is to develop a release in consultation with ENG and will give this immediate attention.
 - 4.1 Microwave to New Carlisle In response to a question by Mr. Saint-Georges concerning the connection by microwave to the TV station being proposed at New Carlisle, MCMT indicated that if the costs for microwave were comparable to the costs of kinescope recordings, the Board no doubt would give careful consideration to an extension by microwave.
 - 4.2 Riviere de Loup and Matane MGMT indicated that no question of basic status could be considered for these two points which are within the "B" coverage area of Rimouski until the proposed patterns are put forward and that the question will depend upon the acceptance by sponsors.
 - 4.3 CFCL Timmins Mr. Saint-Georges enquired whether this station could withdraw its status of Supplementary "A" to the French network and was told that the station could apply to the Board of Governors stating reasons, making the application first through MCMT which would study it and collect the data for the Board.
 - 4.4 Thetford Mines Similarly on the payment of the network connection costs for this station, it was suggested that the station could apply through of the network connection MCMT to the Board of Governors for reconsideration of the arrangements under which its affiliation is maintained.
- 5. Pre-emption Network Time for Local Political Broadcasts Noting that SR had applications in this regard, it was suggested that CB should deal with the principles involved.
- 6. TV Wrestling French Network QUE indicated that there were negotiations for a switch in the time of wrestling from 9.00 to 10.00 p.m. but that the agency was objecting. CB indicated a new proposal received today that the wrestling be put on film and that both English and French networks schedule it at their respective times. It was indicated that there is little chance that the Forum will permit the live pick-up of its main bout at 10.00 p.m. AGM indicated that the sponsor for the French network was informed of the switch and the film suggestion seemed to offer interesting possibilities although it was suggested leave a question of separate local programming for CBMT and CBOT. MGMT asked CB to follow up with Montreal.
